

## SELVAGE QUILTS - THE GREENEST SCRAP QUILTS EVER!

### STUDENT MATERIALS and SUPPLIES:

1/4 yard focus fabric (centers of selvage blocks)  
1 yard muslin (or any other scrap fabric - will be completely covered)  
Selvages - a plastic grocery bag comfortably full will be more than enough  
3/4 yard for border  
1/2 yard for binding  
1 1/4 yards backing  
Batting measuring approximately 44" x 44"  
Sewing machine *with walking foot attachment*, clean and in good working order  
Portable light (optional)  
Power cord with surge protection  
Fabric scissors  
White thread for sewing selvages  
Other neutral color or matching thread for other sewing (your option)  
Thread for machine quilting - color and weight your choice  
Safety pins or basting spray to baste quilt layers together  
Rotary mat and cutter (or just rotary cutter if your facility will have cutting station)  
Ruler for rotary cutting at least 18" long  
Iron and pressing surface (Optional if your facility will have pressing station)  
Quilts from the Selvage Edge by Karen Griska

### STUDENT CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS PRE-CLASS

Focus Fabric - cut 9 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"  
Muslin (or other scrap fabric) - cut 9 squares 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"  
Selvages - cut selvages from any and all of your stash fabrics. Cut strips approximately 1 1/2" wide. No need to struggle for accuracy, but this width works the best for this technique. You'll want to make sure that some of the print is included with the white selvage. You may choose to divide your strips by hot and cool colors, or light and dark values, or just keep them all together for a totally scrappy look.  
Border fabric - 4 strips 5 1/2" by width of fabric  
Binding - 5 strips 2 1/2" by width of fabric  
Backing - you will need a piece cut approximately 44" x 44"
